Gamelan . . .

is the percussion ensemble of Bali and Java. It is composed of bronze or ironkeyed instruments, gongs, drums, flute. strings and singers. The instruments are tuned in two scales, the 5-tone slendro and the 7 tone pelog, with unusual intervals not found in western music. There are about 100 sets of gamelan instruments in America today.

Gamelan Son of Lion . . . is the set of instruments built in America

by Barbara Benary following the model of the small Javanese village orchestra. The keys are of steel, the gongs are from found objects.

The ensemble of players performs both in Rockland County and in downtown New York City. The repertoire features new music by its composer members and others, combining experimental trends and traditional Indonesian musical inspirations.
