1. Aural Shoehorning

by Barbara Benary

The first movement, "Plainsong" from a 5-section work composed in 1996 for Zeitgeist percussion quartet and the Schubert Club Gamelan. The concept is to combine diatonic and gamelan tuning systems in a marriage in which neither partner is expected to convert.

2. The Unraveling

by David Simons

The Unraveling describes the 10 note scale of pelog and slendro intertwining like DNA strands. The bonang, played like a reyong, is in pelog and all the other instruments are slendro. The balance between the two pitch worlds nravels, as does the intricate lattice-work of rhythms, to the point where we hear the reverse engineering. The unraveling of the composer....and the performer.....and the archivist. With lots of incense. When you are led by the hand to a sacrificial ceremony.

3. Nine-Eleven

by Laura Liben

This is Laura's contribution to Gamelan Son of Lion's "Nine-Eleven," a suite of musical responses by composers in the ensemble to the World Trade disaster

4. Woman's Song

by Lisa Karrer

Title piece from Ms. Karrer's multimedia work "Woman's Song: The Story of Roro Mendut" which will be previewed at the Indonesian Consulate in New York City on Friday June 7th 2002. "Woman's Song" uses an expanded style of barang miring; the text is by Sitor Situmorang
